

VISITORS CENTER

We look forward to welcoming you onto campus! The University takes pride in maintaining an open campus. Prospective students, tourists and interested members of the community are welcome to tour our institution.

Below are guidelines and policies that are in place to allow tour groups and tourists to visit the University while ensuring safety and to reducing the disruption of daily activities of the University community. Columbia University is private property and can establish and enforce rules regarding access to campus and use of campus space by any non-affiliated persons.

Columbia University requires all group tours and general tourists, to observe the following guidelines:

- Columbia will not be held liable for any lost or stolen goods, accidents, or injuries.
- All persons suffering bodily injury on Columbia Property, or having knowledge of damage to Columbia Property, are required to report the occurrence the Department of Public Safety immediately after the incident.

- Do not enter campus buildings unaccompanied by a tour guide. These are private workplaces and classrooms. The only buildings open to large tours without prior arrangements are Low Library, Bookstore in Lerner Hall and St. Paul's Chapel.
- Do not disrupt campus and classroom activities.
- Groups should move in a manner that does not block sidewalks, street or building doorways.
- Do not litter, use waste receptacles for trash.
- Groups may not walk on landscaped areas or pick flowers or other vegetation.
- Do not use amplified sound.
- Visitors may not climb on structures or outdoor artwork.
- The tour will take place rain or shine. We recommend checking the weather before your trip and plan according.
- Dress comfortably and wear comfortable walking shoes.
- Arrive on time for your tour. Please know that late arrival will result in a modification of the tour and / or presentation. If any group is more than 30 minutes late, the tour will be cancelled. Between 10-30 minutes late is at the discretion of the Visitors Center and tour guide availability. If your group is running late, call us at (212) 854-4902.
- Use public restrooms provided for visitors. Locations:
 - First floor of Low Library
 - Café 212 in Lerner Hall
- Do not smoke outside of the designated areas (Designated areas can be found under the 'Maps' tab).

- Due to safety concerns, the University bans the use of hoverboards (also known as self-balancing scooters or smart boards) on University campus and prohibits the use of these devices on campus grounds.
- The flying of remote-control drones or other devices for photography or recreational purposes is prohibited.
- Commercial photography and filming without prior permission is prohibited. Group photography and photography and filming inside classrooms and buildings is prohibited. All news media, documentary, and film interview requests are handled through the Office of Communications and Public Affairs in 304 Low Library, 212-854-5573.

Safety

To balance the benefits of an open campus with the safety needs of an urban institution, several security booths are stationed at entrances to the Morningside campus. Public Safety officers are posted 24 hours a day at West 116th Street and Broadway, and West 116th Street and Amsterdam Avenue. Additional officers are stationed Monday through Saturday at a booth at West 119th Street and Amsterdam Avenue. There are also Public Safety officers assigned to patrol either on foot, bicycle, or in vehicles around both campuses. Designated buildings require a valid University ID for entry. Card readers, alarm monitoring systems, and 24-hour recorded video cameras support our efforts by providing direct feeds to the Department of Public Safety Operations Centers.

Consequences of violating visit policies

Columbia University and the Columbia Department of Public Safety reserve the right to ask any individual or group to leave campus property, and may ban tour-group and/or tour-bus operators from the campus for repeated failure to follow the above rules of conduct, or other specific directive from the Department of Public Safety or University official. Further, Columbia University reserves the right to take appropriate legal action against those failing to comply with the policy, including actions under civil or criminal trespass laws.
